Assessment Summary:

Yousef was reassessed following an initial developmental intervention, and he has shown **notable improvement** in the first step of his individualized protocol. However, ongoing **information processing delays** and **developmental delays** remain present. These delays are believed to be **linked to underlying genetic or metabolic variants**, contributing to **acquired features of autism**. The child does not have a fixed autistic profile, but rather acquired traits resulting from processing disruptions. Further investigation is necessary to determine root causes and refine the ongoing intervention plan.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing (Non-Medicinal)

- Continue the current individualized development program targeting processing speed, attention, integration, and comprehension.
- Duration: **4–6 months**, followed by in-person **reevaluation**.
- Reevaluation goals:
 - Measure cognitive and functional progress.
 - Set a new baseline to guide the next intervention phase.
 - Refine the development protocol accordingly.

2. Main Recommended Diagnostic Test (Through Neurazon – Canada):

3. Main Recommended Therapies:

- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy**
 - Frequency: **2–3 sessions per week**
 - To be initiated **after the next 4-month review**.
 - Aim: Rewire and strengthen brain networks to improve processing, language, and social function.
- **Occupational and Behavioral Therapy**
 - To be conducted in parallel with neuroplasticity therapy.
 - Focus: Enhance sensory regulation, adaptive behavior, and daily functional skills.


