**Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment**

### **Overview:**

Mohammad-Ali was assessed at our center due to ongoing concerns regarding his cognitive development and academic performance. The evaluation identified **information processing delays** and **developmental delays**, contributing to **learning difficulties**. At this time, the child **does not meet the criteria for autism**.

As reported by the child's parents and previous medical consultations, past investigations showed **elevated dopamine levels** and an **abnormal MRI**, both of which support the presence of underlying neurological developmental challenges. These findings warrant **further analysis** to understand the biochemical and neurodevelopmental pathways involved and tailor a suitable intervention plan.

### **Recommended Plan:**



- 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing:
  - Initiate a structured intervention focusing on cognitive and processing delays over a 4-month period.
  - o Conduct a reassessment after 4 months, preferably in person.
  - Use reevaluation to establish a developmental baseline and make adjustments as needed.
- 2. Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada):

- 3. Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:
  - o Mitotherapy (Light Therapy): 2 sessions per week
