

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Sulaiman visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. During the evaluation, the child exhibited information processing delays and regression in intellectual development, which have led to acquired features of autism. These features are not reflective of classical autism but rather acquired developmental traits due to underlying physiological and genetic factors. The child requires further analysis and targeted intervention to support continued developmental progress.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing:

- A non-medicinal developmental protocol is to be continued for the next **3–4 months**.
- A reassessment is recommended at the end of this period to reevaluate the baseline and adjust the plan accordingly.
- The child should continue with structured intervention sessions during this time.

Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada):

Recommended Therapy:

- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy** is recommended intensively after two months or upon receiving the test results.

- This therapy will help address processing delays and optimize neuronal function using non-invasive brain-based interventions.

Conclusion:

This assessment confirms that while Sulaiman shows delays in certain developmental areas due to underlying variants, he does not currently meet the criteria for autism. He remains **highly capable of improvement** and is **responding well** to the current protocol. Continued therapy and targeted assessments will support further progress.
