

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Maan visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. During the evaluation, he demonstrated **information processing delays**, **global developmental delays**, and **acquired features of autism** resulting from these developmental delays.

Parents also reported **kidney-related issues**, which previously caused **elevated sodium levels**, suggesting a **biological component** contributing to his developmental profile. While this information is clinically relevant, **further analyses are needed** to determine the degree to which these physiological factors are contributing to his cognitive and developmental challenges.

Maan is **open for improvement**, and early structured intervention is strongly recommended to support developmental progress.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Follow the structured **Development Protocol** for **4 months**.
- Reevaluate the child after this period, preferably **in person**.
- Establish a new baseline during reevaluation.
- Continue with the intervention plan based on progress.

2) Recommended Tests Through Neurazon (Canada)

These analyses help identify biological, metabolic, and neurological factors influencing development.

3) Recommended Therapy:

- **Plasticity Rehabilitation Therapy** (in later stages), focusing on improving information processing, cognitive integration, and developmental skills.
- Therapy frequency and scheduling to be determined after initial progress on the development protocol.

Notes on External Testing:

The recommended tests are conducted through **Neurazon (Canada)**, a bioinformatics company partnered with certified international laboratories.

These are **recommendations**, not obligatory.

They are **external analyses** and **not performed directly through our center**.

Please refer to the plan provided by Neurazon for further information.

Disclaimer:

This assessment is **not a final diagnosis** but a developmental evaluation based on current observations.

The child is **open to improvement**, and findings may change with appropriate intervention.

Recommended tests are optional, external, and intended to support deeper understanding of the child's developmental profile.

This report is **valid for 4 months** from the date of assessment.


