

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Date of Visit: May 1st, 2025

Child's Name: Abdulkadir Bourfoun

Date of Birth: March 21st, 2012

Assessment:

Abdulkadir was assessed in person and exhibits **Information Processing Delays**. However, he **does not score as a case of Autism or ADHD/ADD** based on our current criteria and observation. The child requires further analysis to explore potential underlying causes and guide future intervention strategies.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for the Information Processing:

- Continue with the non-medicinal development protocol for **4 months**
- Reassess the child in person after the protocol period
- Reevaluate the therapeutic baseline and adjust the plan accordingly
- Maintain structured sessions during the intervention phase

2) Recommended Tests (through Neurazon, Canada):

- **Precision Health Analysis – Neurazon (Canada)**
 - Saliva sample
 - 4 months business days turnaround
 - In-depth analysis of metabolic, genetic, and neurological pathways
- **Neuronal Growth Factors Absorption Analysis – Neurazon (Canada)**
 - Hair sample
 - 2 months business days turnaround
 - Repeated every 6–12 months
 - Focused on absorption efficiency and nutrient-related brain support markers

3) Recommended Therapy:

- At this stage, no specific therapy is assigned
- Therapy recommendations will be revisited after the next evaluation, based on progress and test outcomes

Conclusion:

This report is a **rehabilitation assessment**, not a final diagnosis. Abdulkadir is showing signs that warrant further exploration but does **not meet criteria for Autism or ADD/ADHD**. Continued structured support and testing will clarify his developmental profile and optimize his cognitive outcomes.


