Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview

Shamma was assessed at our center on 21-09-2022. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays and developmental delays** that have contributed to **hyperlexia type** 1 and **acquired features of autism**. At this stage, she does not score as a case of autism but remains at risk, requiring close follow-up and structured intervention.

Her presentation indicates developmental vulnerabilities but also demonstrates responsiveness to early intervention. Further analyses are essential to establish clearer biological contributors and refine the intervention plan.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for the Information Processing

- Begin a 4-month structured protocol focusing on improving information processing.
- Conduct a **reevaluation after 4 months**, preferably in person.
- Establish a baseline during reevaluation for measurable tracking.
- Continue with the intervention plan and adapt as needed.

2) Main Recommended Analyses (through Neurazon – Canada)

The recommended analyses are coordinated through **Neurazon** (**Canada**). These tests are **external**, **optional**, **and not conducted directly** at our centers. They provide additional insight into the child's developmental profile to complement therapy. Please refer to their report and assessment.





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3) Therapy

• Neuroplasticity rehabilitation therapy: Recommended to begin in later stages, with an intensive programfocusing on cognitive, linguistic, and adaptive developmental domains.

Conclusion

Shamma presents with hyperlexia type 1 and acquired features of autism, secondary to information processing and developmental delays. While she does not meet the criteria for autism, immediate and structured intervention is necessary to minimize risks and support healthy development. With appropriate therapy and further analyses, she shows potential for meaningful progress.
