Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview

Salama attended our center for a developmental progress assessment. The evaluation indicates **information processing delays and developmental delays**, consistent with a neurodevelopmental profile influenced by biological factors. The child presents with acquired developmental features and has responded positively to intervention efforts so far.

She has demonstrated meaningful improvement on the initial intervention protocol, and several earlier concerns have lessened, indicating good developmental potential. Continued support and structured intervention are recommended to maintain progress and prevent regression.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue structured developmental protocol for 4 months
- Reevaluate afterward (preferably in person) to establish an updated baseline
- Continue consistent intervention and home-support strategies

2) Recommended Analyses Through Neurazon (Canada)

Note: These tests are external and optional through Neurazon. They are not performed directly through our center. Please refer to external report.

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3) Recommended Therapy

- Plasticity rehabilitation therapy (1–2 times per week as tolerated)
- Continue **occupational and speech therapy** as outlined in the child's developmental plan

Conclusion

Salama has shown promising developmental progress, and early improvements highlight strong potential for continued growth. Ongoing therapy, family involvement, and routine reassessment will play an important role in supporting her development.

This assessment reflects current developmental findings and is **not a final diagnosis**. Progress will continue to be monitored at each stage of development.
