

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Ousha Al Mansouri returned for a follow-up developmental assessment. She has shown **significant improvement** since the implementation of the initial intervention protocol. While she continues to experience **information processing delays** and **developmental delays**, her progress over the past months has been **remarkable**, indicating positive response to the tailored therapy program. The current approach should be continued with updated baselines and refined goals for the next phase.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue with the **current non-chemical developmental protocol**.
- **Duration:** 4 months, followed by a reevaluation session (preferably in person).
- Establish a **new baseline** to measure the next stage of progress.
- Maintain regular **intervention sessions and therapy** to support continued improvement.

2. Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada):

3. Recommended Therapy:

- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy**
 - Frequency: **2–3 sessions per week (intensive)**
 - Focus: Enhancing brain connectivity, improving processing speed, and supporting white matter development.

Conclusion:

Ousha is responding well to the intervention and demonstrates strong potential for continued improvement. Her current progress supports the continuation of the existing therapy protocol with added assessments to tailor the plan further. The recommended tests through Neurazon are optional but beneficial for obtaining a more detailed understanding of her developmental profile. This is a working developmental assessment and not a final diagnosis.

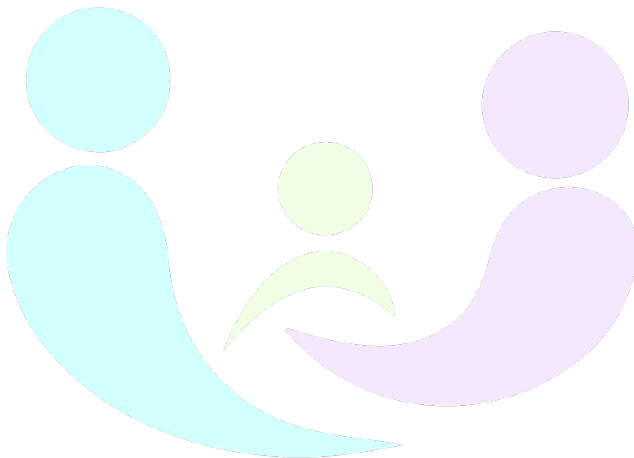
