Overview:

Hareb-Ahmed was assessed at our center on 07-09-2025. The evaluation showed information processing delays and developmental delays. However, he does not score as a case of autism. Previous precision health analyses identified variants contributing to his developmental profile. Encouragingly, Hareb-Ahmed has demonstrated significant improvement and is now ready to progress to the next stage of the protocol.

Recommended Plan:

Therapy:

Hareb-Ahmed presents with developmental and information processing delays but does not meet the criteria for autism. He has shown strong improvement and readiness for the next stage of therapy. With consistent neuroplasticity therapy and continued evaluations, his developmental progress is expected to advance further.
