Assessment Summary:

Adam was assessed on 25-06-2025. He presents with **information processing delays** and **developmental delays** that have led to features of **hyperlexia**, leaning toward **Hyperlexia Type 1**, but not fully developed into Type 2 or Type 3. These features are **acquired** and do not reflect a diagnosis of autism. The child **does not score as a case of autism**, but further analysis is needed to fully understand the underlying causes and optimize his intervention plan.

Recommended Plan:



1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue the non-medicinal development protocol
- Reassess after 4 months, preferably in person
- Reevaluate the plan and establish a new baseline
- Adjust and continue the intervention accordingly

2. Recommended Tests (through Neurazon – Canada):

- Precision Health Analysis
 - o In-depth analysis of physiological and genetic contributing factors
 - o Saliva sample
 - Results in 4 months (business days)
- Neuronal Growth Factors Absorption Analysis
 - o Detailed insight into nutrient absorption and neuronal support
 - o Hair sample
 - o Results in 2 months (business days)
 - o Repeated every 6–12 months

3. Recommended Therapy after Determining the Causes:
