

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Date of Visit: 22-07-2025

Child's Name: sanad-yazid, abuhaykal

Date of Birth: 19-04-2021

Overview:

Sanad visited our center for a developmental evaluation. The assessment revealed developmental delays and information processing challenges, with signs of hyperlexia trending toward Type 2 but not fully meeting its criteria. These characteristics are consistent with **acquired features of high-functioning autism**, which result from the delays rather than a true classical autism. Further assessment is required to monitor progress and guide individualized interventions.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Duration: 4 months
- Reassessment: In person after completion of the protocol
- Objective: Establish a clear developmental baseline and adjust the plan as needed
- Continuation: Maintain the current intervention strategy until reassessment

Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada):

Recommended Therapy:

- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:** To be introduced in later stages; not yet indicated at this point of development

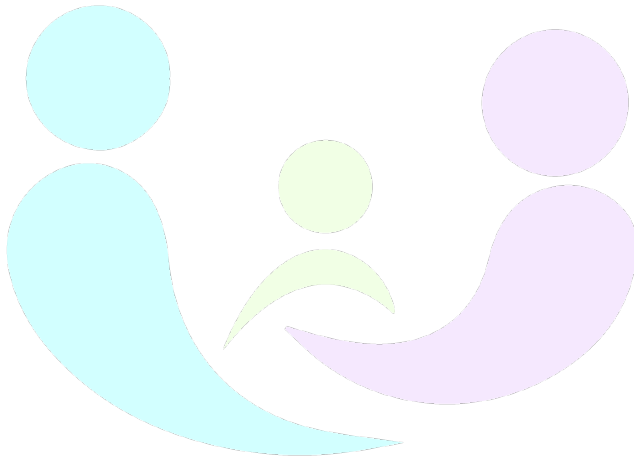
