

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Laith Alhajali was assessed at our center on May 31st, 2025. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays** and **global developmental delays**. Despite these challenges, the child does **not currently meet the criteria for autism**. Instead, the profile reflects general developmental and cognitive challenges that need to be addressed through personalized intervention. Additional testing and analysis are recommended to further understand the biological and functional underpinnings of these delays.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Implement a focused intervention program over the next **4 months**
- Conduct a detailed **in-person reassessment** after the 4-month period
- Establish a clinical and developmental baseline to monitor progress and refine interventions
- Continue with the intervention plan, ensuring consistent therapy and adaptation to the child's needs

2) Main Recommended Analysis (Conducted Through Neurazon – Canada):

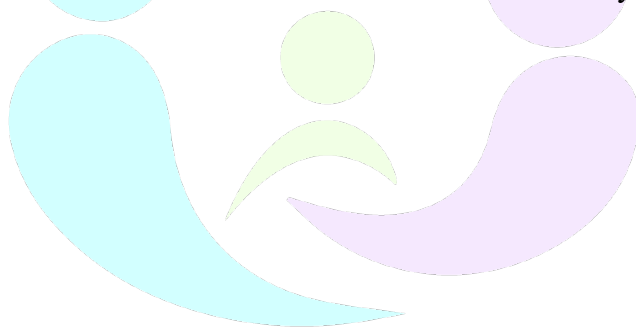

3) Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:

- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:**
 - To begin **immediately** at an intensive level or at least **weekly** to stimulate cognitive flexibility, social interaction, and attention
- **Speech and Occupational Therapy (2ST and 2OT):**
 - Targeting language development, motor skills, and overall adaptive behavior to address the child's comprehensive developmental needs

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
