Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview

Rashid was assessed at our center for developmental progress. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays** and **global developmental delays** that have contributed to **acquired features of autism and motor delays**. However, at this stage Rashid does **not meet the criteria for autism**. These findings suggest early risk features that require close monitoring, structured intervention, and further analyses to better understand underlying causes and to guide targeted therapies.

Recommended Plan



1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- 1. Implement a structured developmental protocol focusing on information processing skills.
- 2. Duration: 4 months, followed by reevaluation (preferably in person).
- 3. Reestablish a baseline during reevaluation to adjust interventions as needed.
- 4. Continue with the intervention plan to support consistent improvement.

2. Main Recommended Analyses (Through Neurazon, Canada)

The recommended analyses are external and conducted through **Neurazon** (**Canada**). These are not performed directly at our centers. Results will be shared with the guardian upon completion and integrated into the child's developmental plan. Please refer to their report and assessment.

3. Therapy

- Speech Therapy (ST): 2 sessions per week.
- Occupational Therapy (OT): 1–2 sessions per week.
- **Mitotherapy (Light-Based Therapy):** 1–2 sessions per week, to be integrated with other therapies.





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Conclusion

This assessment indicates Rashid has information processing and developmental delays with acquired autism features but does not currently meet the criteria for autism. With targeted therapy, structured protocols, and advanced analyses, Rashid remains **open for improvement** and developmental progress.

Notes on External Testing

The recommended analyses are external and conducted through **Neurazon** (Canada). These are not performed directly at our centers. Results will be shared with the guardian upon completion and integrated into the child's developmental plan.
