## **Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment**

#### Overview

Aseel-Mohammad was assessed for developmental progress. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays and developmental delays**, with emerging **hyperlexia-like features**.

It is important to highlight that Aseel experienced a **hypoxia episode**, which may have contributed to her developmental profile. Despite these challenges, she does **not score as a case of autism**.

Further analyses are recommended to explore underlying biological and functional factors affecting her development.

#### **Recommended Plan**

### 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue structured intervention for **4 months**, followed by reassessment (preferably in person).
- Establish a baseline at that stage.
- Continue and adjust the intervention plan accordingly.

#### 2. Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada)

#### 3. Recommended Therapy
