

## Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Mohammad-Almokhtar Sylla was evaluated on 24-09-2025. The assessment indicates that the child has **information processing delays and developmental delays** leading to **acquired features of autism**, specifically resembling **Hyperlexia Type 2** (features aligned with high-functioning autism). These findings highlight both strengths in specific areas and ongoing challenges in information processing and language development. The child requires further analyses to guide targeted support.

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## Recommended Plan

### 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue protocol for **4 months**, followed by reevaluation (preferably in person).
- Reevaluate the plan and establish a **baseline** during the next assessment.
- Continue the intervention plan as appropriate.

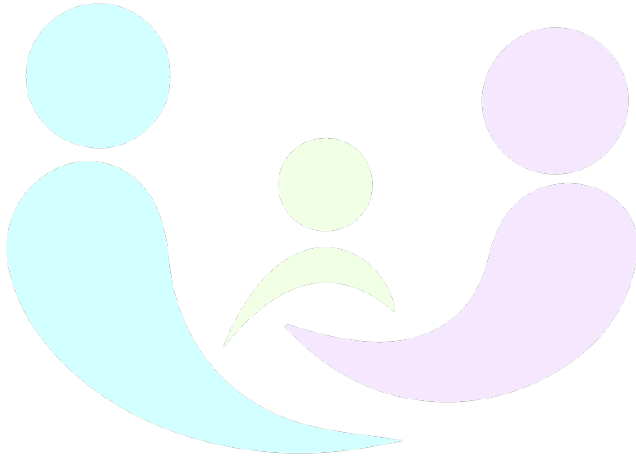
