Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Date of Visit: May 3rd, 2025

Child's Name: Karam Mohammad Al Rajaby

Date of Birth: August 19th, 2015

Assessment:

Karam was assessed in person and was found to have information processing delays and attention difficulties. However, he does not meet the criteria for Autism Spectrum Disorder nor does he qualify as a case of ADHD/ADD. The findings reflect functional developmental concerns that require further follow-up but are not classified as clinical diagnoses at this stage.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Non-Medicinal Protocol for Information Processing:

- To be followed for a period of 4 months, followed by a reevaluation, preferably in person
- Reestablish a functional developmental baseline and adjust the protocol based on progress
- Continue with tailored cognitive and attention-enhancing intervention plans

2) Main Recommended Analysis:

Further testing may be considered following the next assessment based on the child's progress.

3) Main Recommended Therapy:

• Mitotherapy sessions (light therapy): 2–3 sessions per week

Recommendations for the School:

- 1. Seating Arrangement:
 - o Seat Karam close to the teacher and away from windows or high-distraction zones.
- 2. Instruction Support:
 - o Break tasks into small, manageable steps and provide instructions verbally and visually.
- 3. Pacing and Attention:
 - o Allow extra time for instructions and assignments. Use visual timers if needed.





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4. Positive Reinforcement:

o Encourage effort and improvement with praise and short, immediate rewards.

5. Monitoring and Communication:

 Regularly communicate progress with parents and therapists. Maintain a simple daily behavior chart if possible.

6. Avoiding Labels:

 Avoid labeling the child as inattentive or difficult; instead, provide structured support and redirection when needed.

Conclusion:

This is not a final diagnosis but a developmental rehabilitation assessment. Karam has **functional challenges in processing and attention** but is **capable of improvement**. With the right school accommodations and hometherapy alignment, progress is expected over time.
