

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview

Sager Tareq Allabban visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. During the evaluation, he presented with **information processing delays and developmental delays**. These delays have contributed to signs of **Hyperlexia Type 1** as well as **minor acquired features of autism**. Importantly, Sager does **not currently meet the scoring criteria for autism**, though the presence of these features indicates that he is at **risk of progressing toward autism spectrum features** if early intervention is not introduced.

Early detection and intervention at this stage are critical to supporting his developmental trajectory, reducing risks, and improving his long-term outcomes. Further detailed analyses are strongly recommended.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Begin a structured developmental program for a period of **4 months**, followed by reevaluation (preferably in person).
- Establish a **baseline** during this initial phase.
- Continue with ongoing intervention to address processing and developmental delays.

2) Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada)

3) Recommended Therapy

- **Plasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:** 2–3 sessions per week.
This therapy will target **neuroplasticity**, helping strengthen brain connections to improve processing, focus, and language development.

Conclusion

Sager shows developmental vulnerabilities but also demonstrates potential for improvement with early, targeted interventions. He does not score as a case of autism at this time. With structured developmental support, testing through Neurazon, and ongoing therapy, his trajectory can be significantly improved.
