Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Jad visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. During the evaluation, he demonstrated **information processing delays** and **developmental delays**, which are contributing to **hyperlexia closer to Hyperlexia 2**, categorized as **acquired features of high-functioning autism**. These findings indicate that the child processes information differently and requires specialized intervention to support language, comprehension, and cognitive integration.

The child **does not score as a case of true autism**, but his developmental profile shows features acquired from processing and developmental delays, which require continued analysis. Further assessment is needed to clarify the underlying biological contributing factors. The child was assessed by ostathna.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue the protocol for 4 months, followed by a full reevaluation (preferably in person).
- Reassess progress and establish a new developmental baseline.
- Continue with the structured intervention plan designed for information processing and developmental improvement.

Recommended Therapy

- Rehabilitation Therapy:
 - o 2 Occupational Therapy (OT)
 - o 2 Speech Therapy (ST)
 - o 2 Language Therapy (LT)
- Plasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:
 - o To be introduced in later stages, based on progress and acceptance.
