Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Assem visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. The evaluation shows that he has **improved on the first protocol**, demonstrating positive response to the initial intervention plan. The child continues to present with **information processing delays** and **global developmental delays**, which are contributing to **intellectual developmental delays**.

These findings are consistent with **white matter delays** and **variants affecting brain development, metabolic pathways, and synaptic health**, as previously identified through external analyses conducted by Neurazon and other specialists.

The child also has a **history of epilepsy** and is on medication, which remains an important part of his overall developmental profile. Additionally, he shows **digestive intolerance**, supporting the presence of a **biological cause** contributing to his developmental challenges.

The child **does not score as a case of autism**, but due to the combination of neurological, metabolic, and digestive factors, **further assessment is recommended**.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Implement the protocol for **4 months**, followed by a full reevaluation (preferably in person).
- Reevaluate the plan and establish a new baseline.
- Continue with the targeted intervention program aligned with his developmental needs.

2) Main Recommended Analysis

Based on the next evaluation, **further analysis may be required**.
No additional tests are requested at this stage.

3) Recommended Therapy

- **Rehabilitation Therapy:**
 - **2 LT sessions per week** to support language, cognitive processing, and learning capacity.

Notes on External Testing

The previous analyses were conducted through **Neurazon (Canada)**, a bioinformatics company partnered with accredited international laboratories. These tests are **external, optional, and not performed through our center directly**. Please refer to Neurazon's plan for complete details.
