Overview:

Shama Hamood Mohammed Suotan Aldarai was assessed at our center due to developmental concerns. The evaluation revealed signs of **information processing delays**, **cognitive developmental delays**, and **intellectual developmental delays**. These challenges have contributed to **acquired features of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)**. However, these features are not necessarily indicative of classical autism but rather stem from underlying developmental factors.

Further assessment is necessary to clarify the causes and guide an individualized intervention plan.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing (Non-Medicinal):

- o Continue protocol implementation for 4 months.
- o Conduct a follow-up evaluation, preferably in person, to establish a detailed baseline.
- o Adjust the intervention plan according to progress.

2. Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada):

 Note: These tests are external and not conducted through our center. Please refer to the Neurazon-provided plan. These are suggestions to support precision-based care.

3. Recommended Therapy:

- Speech and Occupational Therapy:
 - To begin immediately to support communication, sensory regulation, and daily living skills.
- Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:
 - To be considered in the later stages, once the foundational protocol and evaluations are complete.

• Reassessment is advised after 4 months to monitor the child's response to intervention and revise the plan if needed.
