

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview

Mahmoud was assessed at our center for developmental progress. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays** and **intellectual developmental delays**, with **acquired features of autism**. Encouragingly, previous analyses indicate **potential for brain development**, suggesting that Mahmoud is open for improvement. To better understand the underlying causes and support his development, further analyses are recommended.

Recommended Plan

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

1. Initiate a structured developmental protocol focusing on information processing.
2. Duration: 4–6 months, followed by reevaluation (preferably in person).
3. Reassess baseline progress at the next evaluation to refine the plan.
4. Incorporate **light therapy sessions** (1–2 times per week).

2. Recommended Tests (Through Neurazon, Canada)

The recommended **Precision Health Analysis** is carried out through **Neurazon (Canada)**. These are external assessments, not conducted directly at our centers. Results will be reviewed with the guardian upon completion. Please refer to their report and assessment.

3. Therapy

- **Mitotherapy (Light-Based Therapy):** 1–2 sessions per week.
- **Speech Therapy (ST):** To support communication and language development.
- **Occupational Therapy (OT):** To enhance sensory regulation, adaptive functioning, and developmental skills.

Conclusion

Mahmoud presents with information processing and intellectual developmental delays, alongside acquired features of autism. Despite these findings, the child demonstrates potential for improvement through structured interventions. With targeted therapies and advanced testing, Mahmoud is expected to show measurable progress.

The recommended **Precision Health Analysis** is carried out through **Neurazon (Canada)**. These are external assessments, not conducted directly at our centers. Results will be reviewed with the guardian upon completion.
