

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Kenzi visited our center for a follow-up developmental progress assessment. Based on the evaluation, **Kenzi has shown great improvement** on the previously implemented protocols and has **overcome many of the challenges** she initially presented with. The current assessment indicates positive developmental progress, though further analysis is recommended to ensure complete resolution of remaining physiological factors.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for the Information Processing:

- Continue the development protocol for **4 months**, followed by a reassessment (preferably in person).
- Establish a new baseline and adapt the plan accordingly.
- Continue the intervention plan tailored to her progress.

2. Recommended Tests (through Canada):

- **Gut Intolerance Analysis – Neurazon (Canada):**
 - Provides a detailed overview of gut-related intolerances.
 - **Sample Type:** Hair
 - **Turnaround Time:** 2 months (business days)
 - **Repeat:** Every 6–12 months
- **Neuronal Growth Factors Absorption Analysis – Neurazon (Canada):**
 - Assesses how well the body absorbs key neurological growth components.
 - **Sample Type:** Hair
 - **Turnaround Time:** 2 months (business days)
 - **Repeat:** Every 6–12 months

3. Recommended Therapy (after analyzing test results):

- **Occupational Therapy:** 2 sessions/week
- **Speech Therapy:** 2 sessions/week
- **Mitotherapy:** 2 Laser Therapy sessions per week
- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy (UAE):** Intensive sessions tailored to support brain reorganization and continued progress.


