Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Mawadah Maher Jaber was assessed at our center on May 25th, 2025. The child shows signs of **information processing delays** and **intellectual developmental delays**, which have contributed to the development of **acquired features of autism**. These features do not reflect classical autism, but rather a result of the delays impacting communication, interaction, and behavior patterns.

Further testing is recommended to identify contributing biological and functional factors in order to personalize an effective intervention strategy.

Recommended Plan:

- 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing:
 - o Continue the developmental intervention protocol for a period of 4 months
 - o Conduct an in-person reevaluation after the 4-month period
 - Establish a clinical baseline and modify the plan as needed based on observed progress
- 2. Main Recommended Analysis (conducted through Neurazon Canada):

Please refer to there assessment and report. These tests are provided externally through Neurazon (Canada) and are not mandatory, but they are strongly recommended to guide a precision-based care plan.

- 3. Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:
 - Mitotherapy Therapy Frequency to be determined based on absorption analysis results
 - o Neuroplasticity Therapy To begin in September or when ready
 - Speech Therapy (ST): 2 sessions per week
 - Occupational Therapy (OT): 1 to 2 sessions per week depending on developmental needs
