Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Husen-Mohamed was assessed at our center due to concerns about developmental progress. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays** and broader **developmental delays**, which have resulted in **acquired features of autism**. These features appear to be functional and secondary to neurological delays, rather than representing a classical autism diagnosis.

The child demonstrates potential for improvement with targeted intervention, especially in structured environments that support sensory integration, comprehension, and social communication.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing:



- Begin a non-medicinal developmental protocol tailored to improving sensory processing, attention, and social engagement.
- **Duration:** 4 months
- Action: Reevaluate progress and establish a new baseline following this period.
- Adapt the plan as necessary to fit the child's evolving developmental profile.

Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada):

Recommended Therapy:

• Therapy in Home Country: Families are encouraged to initiate regular therapy at a qualified local center.

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• Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy: To be introduced in an intensive format once the child demonstrates readiness. This therapy aims to improve information processing and functional connectivity in the brain.

Conclusion:

This is a **developmental evaluation**, not a final diagnosis. The signs currently observed in Husen-Mohamed are **acquired features** and can potentially improve significantly with appropriate, individualized care. Further assessments and commitment to therapy will be crucial for long-term developmental gains.
