

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Laith Dheyaa Alqubbanchi visited our center for a developmental assessment. During the evaluation, Laith demonstrated **information processing delays and general developmental delays**. However, the child **does not meet the criteria for a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder** at this time. These findings indicate the presence of developmental concerns that require early intervention but **do not constitute an autism case** based on current scoring and observations.

Laith requires continued monitoring and support to address these early delays. His profile suggests that, with timely and targeted intervention, improvement is highly possible.

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Recommended Plan:

1. **Development Protocol for Information Processing:**
 - Begin a structured, non-medicinal intervention protocol focused on enhancing information processing.
 - **Duration:** 4 months
 - **Reevaluation:** In person after 4 months to assess baseline and adjust the plan if needed.
 - Continue ongoing intervention tailored to developmental milestones.
2. **Therapy Recommendations:**
 - **Speech and Occupational Therapy:** Continue as currently prescribed.
 - **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:** Begin intensive sessions as soon as possible to support cognitive and functional brain development.
3. **Next Steps:**
 - Further testing and analyses will be considered **after the next evaluation**, depending on the child's progress.
