

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Date of Visit: 19-06-2025

Child's Name: Latifa Rashid Aldoseri

Date of Birth: 18-10-2018

Overview:

Latifa was reassessed at our center on 19 June 2025. The child has shown **remarkable improvement** following the initial stage of developmental protocols. Despite this, she continues to exhibit **information processing delays, cognitive developmental delays, and acquired features of autism**, which are not reflective of classical autism but have developed due to underlying genetic factors.

Importantly, Latifa has been identified with a genetic condition known as **Anemia, Hypochromic Microcytic, with Iron Overload 2 (OMIM: 615234)**, inherited in an **autosomal dominant** pattern. This condition may contribute to or exacerbate neurological and cognitive developmental challenges through dysregulated iron metabolism and oxidative stress, and must be considered in all ongoing interventions and nutritional planning.

Further in-depth testing is recommended to better define the physiological contributors to her current developmental profile and refine the support plan.

Recommended Plan:

1. **Development Protocol for Information Processing:**
 - Continue the intervention protocol for **4 months**, followed by an **in-person reassessment**.
 - Establish a new baseline based on progress and update the intervention plan accordingly.
2. **Main Recommended Analysis through Neurazon (Canada):**
 - **Please refer to their report.**
3. **Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:**
 - **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy (Intensive)**
 - Frequency: **2–3 sessions per week**
 - Focus: Strengthening cognitive function, language development, and processing speed through structured stimulation techniques.

Follow-Up Plan:

- A **comprehensive reassessment is advised after 4 months** to incorporate developmental changes and test results into a revised strategy.


