Overview

Hamed was assessed at our center on 04-09-2025. The evaluation revealed **information** processing delays and developmental delays leading to hyperlexia closer to type 3, though he has not fully reached that classification. At this stage, he does not score as a case of autism, but further analyses are necessary to clarify the underlying causes and to track his developmental trajectory. Early and targeted interventions will be crucial in supporting his continued progress.

Recommended Plan



- Implement a structured 4-month developmental protocol focusing on information processing.
- Conduct a **reevaluation after 4 months**, preferably in person.
- Establish a **baseline** at reevaluation to monitor measurable improvements.
- Continue with the intervention plan and adjust based on progress.

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3) Therapy

• Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy: Intensive program, 2–3 sessions per week, to begin immediately. Focus on improving cognitive flexibility, adaptive learning skills, and language comprehension.

Conclusion

Hamed demonstrates **information processing and developmental delays associated with hyperlexia closer to type 3**. Although he does not meet the criteria for autism, he requires structured intervention to ensure continued improvement. Intensive therapy combined with follow-up analyses will provide deeper understanding and measurable progress.
