Overview

Layan Hawamdeh visited Ostathna Center – Jordan for a developmental progress assessment.

The evaluation showed that Layan has information-processing delays and intellectual developmental delays, as well as features of autism due to potential brain abnormalities as reported by parents and described in previous MRI findings and prior medical doctors' assessments.

Ongoing multidisciplinary therapy is strongly recommended to address these challenges and support her continued development.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Non-Medicinal Protocol for the Information Processing

- Continue the development non-medicinal protocol for 4 months.
- Reevaluate the child after 4 months, preferably in person, to establish a new baseline.
- Continue with the intervention plan based on the reassessment findings.
- The child requires speech therapy and occupational therapy to be provided simultaneously to ensure optimal progress.











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Conclusion

Layan's profile indicates the need for **consistent intervention through Ostathna Center – Jordan**, emphasizing **parallel speech and occupational therapy**.

Following the 4-month protocol with regular reassessment is recommended to optimize gains in information processing, communication, and adaptive functioning.
