

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Marah Hamdan was assessed at our center on July 24th, 2025. The child has shown substantial improvement following the initial intervention protocol. Most of the previously acquired features resembling autism have significantly improved. However, the child continues to experience developmental and information processing delays. These challenges are associated with Rett syndrome, a rare genetic neurological disorder that affects brain development.

Despite the genetic basis of her condition, Marah has demonstrated potential for improvement, particularly with supportive and adaptive therapies. Continued intervention and regular reassessments are essential for tracking her developmental trajectory and maximizing her abilities.

Recommended Plan

1. **Development Protocol for Information Processing:**
 - **Duration:** 4 months
 - **Objectives:** Strengthen cognitive engagement, regulate sensory responses, and support adaptive function
 - **Follow-Up:** In-person reassessment to establish updated baseline and adjust the therapeutic approach
2. **Recommended Therapy:**
 - **Physical Therapy:**
 - Focus on motor coordination, muscle strength, and functional mobility
 - **Occupational Therapy:**
 - Target fine motor skills, daily living tasks, and sensory integration
 - Therapy should be individualized and monitored closely based on Marah's evolving needs

Recommended Tests

- **Next Recommended Analyses:**

Further diagnostic testing and analyses are to be determined based on Marah's progress at the next evaluation. At this stage, the current focus remains on therapy and functional gains.

Please refer to the future treatment plan for further updates. Any additional analyses will be recommended after progress is monitored in the next in-person reassessment.

Follow-Up Plan:

- **Reassessment Interval:**

Reassessment is recommended after 4 months to measure response to therapy and determine the need for additional testing or interventions.


