Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Jad Omar Hamdan was assessed at our center to explore concerns regarding his cognitive development and learning behavior. The evaluation revealed clear **information processing delays** as well as **learning difficulties** that are impacting his academic and social performance. These challenges are not aligned with autism spectrum disorder but rather indicate disruptions in cognitive flow, comprehension, memory processing, and attention integration. This assessment was performed through Ostathna for educational support.

Further biomedical analysis is necessary to better understand the physiological contributors and design a personalized, supportive plan that enhances Jad's learning and development.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing:

- Initiate a structured intervention protocol focusing on information processing, attention, and memory.
- Duration: 4 months.
- Reevaluate in person following the intervention period to establish a baseline and assess progress.
- Modify and continue the plan based on the child's individual response.

3) Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:

- Mitotherapy (Light-Based Therapy):
 - o 2–3 sessions per week.
 - o Supports cognitive regulation, attention enhancement, and brain energy balance.





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Conclusion:

Jad presents with learning challenges and information processing delays that require targeted support. With early and guided intervention, there is strong potential for academic and cognitive improvement. The recommended biomedical testing and therapy will help reveal underlying causes and provide direction for individualized strategies.
