

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Ward-Issa was assessed at our center and displays clear signs of **information processing delays** and **intellectual developmental delays**, which have led to **acquired features of autism**. An MRI conducted earlier by his neurologist confirmed **developmental delay**, and genetic testing further supported these findings. While not a final diagnosis, these indicators call for a structured and targeted intervention plan. Further analysis is needed to guide ongoing treatment.

Recommended Plan:

1. **Development Protocol for Information Processing**
 - Duration: 4 months
 - In-person reassessment preferred
 - Establish a baseline to monitor improvements and adjust the intervention plan
2. **Main Recommended Analyses (to be scheduled at later stages):**
 - Based on progress and results from the initial 4-month plan
 - Final list to be determined during next evaluation
3. **Recommended Therapy (Based on Current Status):**
 - **Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy**
 - **Mitotherapy:** 2–3 sessions per week

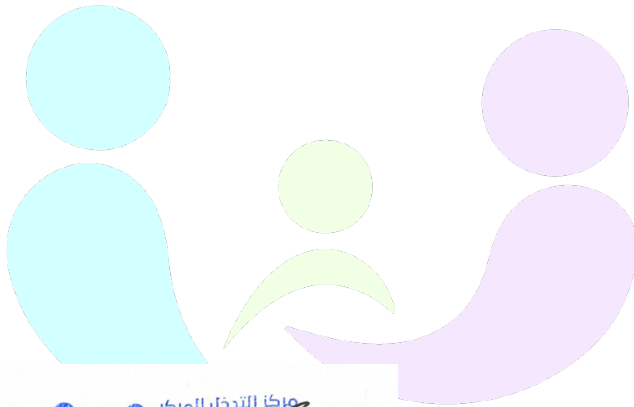
