Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Rashid was assessed at our center on 10-09-2025. The evaluation revealed information processing delays and developmental delays leading to **hyperlexia type 2** and acquired features of autism. While Rashid does not score as a definitive case of autism, these findings suggest that his developmental profile requires close monitoring and specialized support. He is capable of improvement with consistent intervention and further analysis.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for the Information Processing

- Implement the developmental protocol for 4 months.
- Reevaluate the child after this period, preferably in person.
- Establish a new baseline at the time of reassessment.
- Continue with the tailored intervention plan.

2) Main Recommended Analyses (Through Neurazon, Canada)

The recommended analyses are coordinated through **Neurazon (Canada)**. Please note these are external tests, not conducted directly at our center. Please refer to their report and assessment.

3) Recommended Therapy

- **Neuroplasticity rehabilitation therapy (intensive, in later stages).**
This therapy will be essential to support improvements in information processing, developmental skills, and communication abilities.

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Conclusion:

Rashid demonstrates information processing and developmental challenges, with signs of hyperlexia 2 and acquired autism features. With continued intervention, structured therapies, and further analysis, Rashid has significant potential for developmental progress.


