Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Saud Hakem Al Harbi visited our center on 31-05-2025 for a comprehensive developmental assessment. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays** and **intellectual developmental delays**, which have led to **acquired features of Autism** and associated **learning difficulties**. The child demonstrates challenges in integrating sensory and cognitive information, impacting his ability to learn and interact in typical developmental contexts.

While the child exhibits signs of acquired autism features, it is essential to understand that these are not due to classical genetic autism but rather secondary to underlying processing and intellectual challenges. A thorough evaluation of contributing factors is warranted.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Implement an **intensive**, **individualized program** tailored to his information processing difficulties.
- Reevaluate the child after 4 months, preferably through an in-person follow-up, to monitor progress and adjust interventions.
- Establish a clear **baseline** to measure improvements and refine the treatment plan.
- Continue with **regular neuroplasticity and cognitive-based interventions** as part of the therapy program.

2) Main Recommended Analysis by Neurazon:

3) Recommended Therapy after Determining the Causes:

- Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy (intensive start from now):
 - o Launch immediately to stimulate cognitive and neuronal recovery.
 - Structured and personalized sessions targeting the child's specific processing and developmental challenges.
