Overview

Mohammed was assessed on 24-11-2025 for developmental progress. The evaluation indicates **information processing delays** and **global developmental delays** that have led to features resembling **hyperlexia closer to Hyperlexia Type 2**, which falls under **acquired features of high-functioning autism**, but not a true case of autism. These findings suggest a developmental pattern influenced by cognitive processing delays, requiring targeted intervention and further analysis to determine underlying causes. The child was assessed by ostathna.

Mohammed is responsive to intervention and remains **open for improvement**, especially with structured developmental protocols and continued therapy.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Implement the developmental protocol for the next **4 months**.
- Reevaluate afterward (preferably **in person**) to measure progress.
- Reestablish the baseline after reassessment.
- Continue with the structured intervention plan already initiated.

2) Recommended Tests Through Neurazon (Canada)

(All analyses are conducted externally through Neurazon, a bioinformatics company partnered with accredited international laboratories. These tests are optional and not conducted directly through our center.)

3) Recommended Therapy

- **Rehabilitation Therapy**
 - Plasticity Rehabilitation Therapy (to begin in later stages).
- **Occupational and Speech Therapy**
 - To continue intensively according to the child's individualized therapy plan.

Notes on External Testing

The recommended tests are conducted through **Neurazon (Canada)**, a bioinformatics company partnered with certified laboratories worldwide. These are **supportive recommendations**, not mandatory requirements. They are **not carried out through our center directly**. Please refer to the Neurazon plan for processing, timelines, and sample submission.

This assessment is not a final diagnosis but a developmental evaluation based on current observations. The child is open to improvement, and findings may change with progress and intervention. 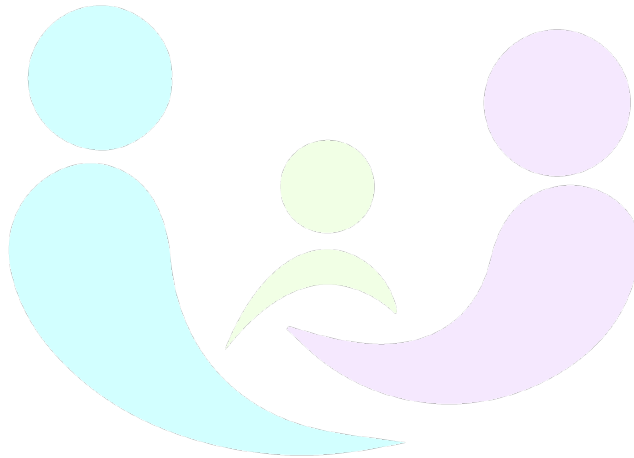
