### Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

### Overview

Abd Al Majeed was assessed for his developmental progress. The evaluation shows that he has **improved greatly on the first protocol**, demonstrating positive responsiveness to intervention.

Despite these improvements, he continues to show **information processing delays and cognitive developmental delays**. Features of autism are present, primarily due to **variants affecting brain development, white matter delays, and abnormal electrical activity**, as previously indicated in a **Precision Health Analysis performed outside the center**.

Further analyses are recommended to better understand the underlying biological and functional factors influencing his development.

### Recommended Plan

#### 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue intervention over the next **4 months**, followed by reassessment (preferably in person).
- Establish a new baseline at that point.
- Adjust and continue the intervention plan as needed.

#### 2. Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada)

### 3. Recommended Therapy

- **Plasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:** to be introduced in later stages.
- **Occupational Therapy and Sensory Integration Therapy:**
  - Address behavioral issues such as head banging.
  - Desensitization protocols to help him adapt to wearing head devices or EEG monitoring in the future while awake.

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### Conclusion

This assessment is not a final diagnosis but a developmental evaluation. Abd Al Majeed has shown significant improvement on the first protocol and continues to be capable of further progress. With continued intervention, reassessment, and targeted therapies, his developmental outcomes can be enhanced.
