

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Hadeef Ali Mohamed was assessed on May 28th, 2025. The evaluation identified **information processing delays** and **developmental delays**, with signs of **hyperlexia** and **minor acquired features of autism**. However, based on the full developmental and behavioral profile, the child does **not meet the diagnostic criteria for autism**. These findings highlight the need for early intervention and close monitoring, especially considering the potential for rapid neurodevelopmental changes at this age.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Initiate a structured early intervention program
- Duration: **4 months**
- Reassessment to be conducted **in person** after protocol completion
- Establish and monitor developmental baselines
- Adjust the intervention as needed based on clinical observations and parent feedback

2) Main Recommended Analysis (for later stages, through Neurazon – Canada):


Please refer to their own report. These tests are external and performed via Neurazon (Canada). They are optional but recommended for personalized therapeutic planning.

3) Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:

- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy** (2–3 sessions per week)
 - To enhance cognitive flexibility, attention, and sensory processing integration
- **Speech and language support** may be considered following reevaluation
