

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Mona Alfahad was assessed at our center on May 29th, 2025. The evaluation indicated the presence of **information processing delays** and **global developmental delays**. While the child demonstrates certain traits that may overlap with autism, the current assessment does **not support a diagnosis of autism**. However, based on parental reports, there is a potential **risk of abnormal brain activity**, though not yet confirmed via EEG. This possibility should be monitored closely. Additional comprehensive analysis is necessary to determine contributing factors and to guide individualized intervention.

Recommended Plan:

EICADD

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Begin a tailored developmental protocol for **4 months**
- Reevaluate the child **in person** after the initial protocol period
- Establish a clinical baseline and track progress systematically
- Continue with structured therapeutic sessions throughout the period

2) Main Recommended Analysis (Conducted Through Neurazon – Canada):

3) Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:

- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:**
 - To begin **immediately**, either **intensively** or **at least once per week** depending on feasibility
 - Focused on enhancing cognitive pathways, processing speed, and neural adaptation


