Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Iskander Bensib visited our center on 31-05-2025 for a comprehensive developmental assessment. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays** and **developmental delays** that currently do not meet the criteria for an autism diagnosis. Although the child does not score as a case of autism, these delays indicate underlying challenges in integrating sensory and cognitive information, which may impact learning and behavior.

Further analysis is required to understand the causes and to tailor a precise intervention plan that will help Iskander reach his developmental potential.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Initiate an intensive, individualized program focusing on information processing challenges.
- Reevaluate after 4 months, preferably through an in-person assessment, to monitor progress and adjust interventions.
- Establish a **clear baseline** to measure improvements and refine the treatment plan.
- Continue with **regular neuroplasticity and cognitive-based interventions** as part of the therapy program.

2) Main Recommended Analysis:

3) Recommended Therapy after Determining the Causes:

- Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy (intensive or weekly to start immediately):
 - o Begin immediately to stimulate cognitive and neuronal pathways.
 - Tailored to Iskander's specific information processing and developmental challenges.
