

## Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

### Overview

Mohammad Rabah Zallom was assessed at our center on 01 October 2025. The evaluation indicated **information-processing delays** and **developmental delays**, which have led to **hyperlexia closer to Hyperlexia Type 2**.

This presentation is associated with **features of high-functioning autism** driven by the hyperlexic profile. While Mohammad does not meet the full criteria for autism, these acquired features require **early intervention and ongoing monitoring** to support development and prevent further progression.

### Recommended Plan

#### 1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue with the tailored development protocol for **4 months**.
- Reassess after 4 months—preferably **in person**—to establish a baseline and make any needed adjustments to the intervention plan.
- Continue with **ongoing** intervention to optimize developmental outcomes.

#### 2) Main Recommended Analyses – Conducted through Neurazon (Canada)

##### Notes on External Testing:

The recommended test is conducted through **Neurazon (Canada)**, a bioinformatics company partnered with certified laboratories worldwide. This test is **external to our center**.

### 3) Recommended Therapy

- **Rehabilitation Therapy:**
  - **2 Speech-Therapy (ST) sessions per week**
  - **2 Occupational-Therapy (OT) sessions per week**
  - **1–2 Language-Therapy (LT) sessions per week**

### Conclusion

Mohammad's profile shows a hyperlexic pattern leaning toward Hyperlexia Type 2, with features of high-functioning autism that can be effectively addressed with **consistent early intervention and tailored therapies**. Ongoing monitoring and personalized adjustments to his development plan will be crucial for achieving optimal progress.
