
Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Adam-Amaar Alsaka was assessed at our center on 29-07-2025. The child presents with information processing delays and developmental delays. He demonstrates hyperlexia traits closer to Hyperlexia 2, but not fully meeting the criteria. The child also exhibits acquired features of high-functioning autism. Further detailed analysis is recommended to better understand the underlying contributing factors and to optimize his developmental support.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing:

- Implement the protocol for 4 months.
 - Reevaluate the child in person after the 4-month period.
 - Establish a baseline and continue the intervention plan accordingly.

2. Main Recommended Analyses:

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3. Recommended Therapy:

- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy**
 - Intensive sessions are recommended to start as soon as possible.
 - **Rehabilitation (OT and ST)**
 - Occupational and speech therapy should begin in Jordan to support language and cognitive development.



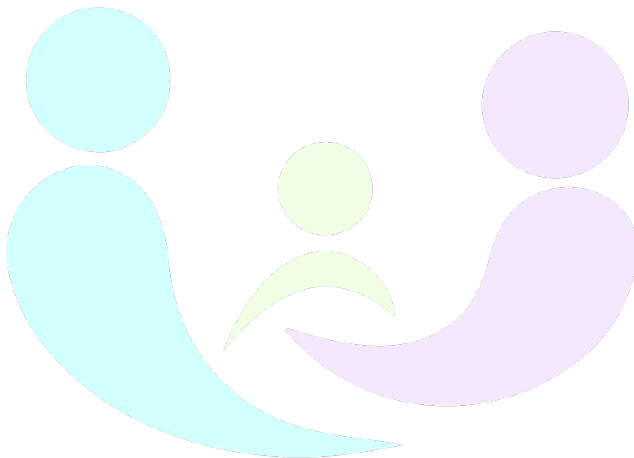
