Assessment

Mohamad-Mustafa was assessed at our center and presented with **information processing delays and cognitive global developmental delay**. These developmental challenges have contributed to **acquired features**, but he does not meet the criteria for a confirmed case of autism. Further analyses are recommended to better understand the underlying biomedical and developmental factors influencing his profile.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol (Rehabilitation Focus)

- Continue with the **information processing rehabilitation protocol** for 4 months.
- A **reevaluation in person** is strongly advised after this period to establish a new baseline.
- Continue with a structured and individualized intervention plan adapted to his needs.

2) Main Recommended Analyses (through Neurazon – Canada)

3) Recommended Therapy

- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy** – to be introduced in later stages once his baseline has been fully established.
- Therapy may eventually include:

 - **Occupational Therapy (OT)**
 - **Learning Therapy (LT)**

Conclusion

Mohamad-Mustafa demonstrates **global developmental and information processing delays** with acquired features. With consistent rehabilitation, external biomedical analyses, and timely initiation of neuroplasticity therapy, the child has strong potential for developmental improvement.
