
Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Aryam and Nouram Jaffal, twin sisters, were assessed at our center on July 24th, 2025. Both children present with developmental delays and information processing difficulties. These challenges have led to features consistent with acquired features of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), including delayed social-emotional responses, communication difficulties, and impaired adaptive skills. Both children have hyperlexia closer to hyperlexia 2.

Despite these challenges, both children demonstrate potential for cognitive and developmental improvement, especially with early and personalized intervention. A comprehensive support plan is necessary to address their individual needs while also leveraging their shared traits as twins to support joint development.

Recommended Plan

1. **Development Protocol for Information Processing:**
 - **Duration:** 4 months
 - **Objective:** Strengthen cognitive function, communication, and adaptive responses
 - **Follow-Up:** Reassessment after 4 months, preferably in person, to adjust the intervention plan based on updated outcomes
2. **Recommended Therapy:**
 - **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy**
 - To be introduced at a moderate pace and intensified in later stages
 - Tailored to each child's profile, while incorporating some shared activities to enhance social interaction

Follow-Up Plan:

- **Reassessment Interval:**

Reassessment is advised after 4 months for each child to monitor developmental progression and adjust therapeutic strategies accordingly.
