

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Mohammed was evaluated at our center due to **Information Processing Delays** and **Developmental Delays**, which have led to **acquired features of autism**. These features are not part of a true autism diagnosis but are linked to underlying processing and developmental challenges. The initial assessment indicates **multiple potential causes** requiring further investigation to understand and address the child's unique profile.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Non-Chemical Protocol for Information Processing:

- Initiate a tailored, non-chemical development protocol.
- Conduct the program for **4 months** and reassess in-person.
- Establish a clear baseline for tracking progress.
- Continue with structured sessions and therapy.

2) Main Recommended Analysis (via Neurazon – Canada):

3) Recommended Therapy:

- Continue structured **occupational and speech therapy** as part of the foundational intervention.


