Overview:

Both children were evaluated for developmental progress and information-processing functions.

Hussein Ammer

Hussein presents with information processing delays and global developmental delays, which are impacting learning, communication, and general developmental milestones. These delays are currently contributing to learning challenges. Further analysis and structured intervention are required to support developmental progress.

Akram Ammer

Akram also presents with information processing delays and developmental delays; however, his processing speed and responsiveness are comparatively higher than Hussein's. Delays are more prominent in social-communication skills and speech. Continued monitoring and structured developmental support are recommended.

Both children are capable of improvement with consistent intervention and monitoring.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue structured developmental protocol for 4 months
- Re-evaluate afterward, preferably in person
- Establish a baseline and adjust plan based on progress
- Continue therapy and structured stimulation consistently

2) Recommended Analyses (External – Neurazon, Canada)

The recommended tests are conducted through Neurazon (Canada), a bioinformatics company partnered with accredited international laboratories. These tests are optional and provided as guidance to help understand biological factors contributing to developmental delays. They are **not conducted through EICADD directly**.

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3) Recommended Therapy

- Plasticity-based rehabilitation therapy: 2–3 sessions per week
- Structured Occupational Therapy
- Speech & Language Therapy according to each child's needs
