

## Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

### Overview

Bassam was assessed at our center on 06-09-2025. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays** and **developmental delays** that are contributing to **cognitive developmental features** and **acquired features of autism**. The child has the potential for improvement. These findings highlight the need for a structured developmental approach as well as further analyses to understand the underlying biological and functional causes.

### Recommended Plan

#### 1) Development Protocol for the Information Processing

- Implement a structured protocol for **4 months**, focusing on strengthening information processing skills.
- Reevaluate after 4 months, preferably in person.
- Establish a baseline during reevaluation for measurable progress tracking.
- Continue and refine the intervention plan according to outcomes.

#### 2) Main Recommended Analyses (through Neurazon – Canada)

#### 3) Therapy

- **Neuroplasticity rehabilitation therapy** to be introduced in **later stages** once a baseline is established, with intensive sessions planned to maximize developmental gains.

## Conclusion

Bassam presents with information processing and developmental delays, alongside intellectual developmental features and acquired autism traits. While further analyses are required to pinpoint underlying causes, early intervention remains critical. Structured therapy and periodic external analyses will provide clarity and direction for tailored developmental support. A reassessment in 4 months is essential to evaluate progress and adjust the intervention plan.
