Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Assessment

Ahmad visited our center for a developmental progress evaluation on 27-04-2025. The assessment revealed that the child has **improved greatly** following the first step of the protocol. However, the child continues to present with:

- Information Processing Delay
- Acquired features of Autism attributed to an identified genetic variant.

This evaluation reflects the child's current developmental progress and is intended to guide further intervention planning. It is not a medical diagnosis. Ahmad shows strong potential for continued improvement under structured and consistent interventions.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue targeted therapy sessions aimed at improving cognitive speed, executive functioning, and information integration.
- Duration: 3 months
- **Reevaluation:** After 3 months, preferably in person, to assess progress and adjust the intervention plan accordingly.
- Goal: Establish a new developmental and functional baseline based on measurable outcomes.

2) Recommended Tests (Based on the Next Evaluation)

• Neuronal Growth Factors Absorption Analysis (through Neurazon – Canada):

A detailed analysis to evaluate the absorption capacity of critical neuronal growth factors necessary for optimal brain development and synaptic function.

Sample: Hair

Turnaround Time: 2 months (business days)

Frequency: Recommended to be repeated every 6–12 months depending on clinical progress.





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3) Recommended Therapy

• Light Therapy:

Targeted light exposure sessions intended to enhance neuronal activation, support mood regulation, and promote cognitive resilience and plasticity.

Follow-Up Plan

Reassessment:

Scheduled after completing the current intervention protocol (approximately 3 months) to evaluate developmental gains and adjust therapeutic approaches as needed.

Monitoring:

Continuous observation and feedback from therapy sessions, parental input, and behavioral responses will be documented to guide next-phase planning.

• Important Note:

This assessment provides a developmental framework for intervention and support planning and is not considered a definitive medical diagnosis. Ongoing improvements are expected with adherence to the recommended plan.
