Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Rashid-Ali was assessed at our center on 07-09-2025. The evaluation indicated information processing delays and developmental delays leading to acquired features of autism. Additionally, Rashid-Ali demonstrates hyperlexia between types 2 and 3. While he does not meet the criteria for autism, these features highlight the need for immediate and structured intervention. Further analyses are recommended to better understand the underlying biological contributors.

Recommended Plan:

- 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing
 - o Implement a structured protocol for 4 months targeting information processing.
 - o Reevaluate after 4 months, preferably in person.
 - Establish a new baseline during reevaluation.
 - o Continue with the intervention plan with appropriate adjustments.
- 2. Main Recommended Analyses (through Neurazon Canada):

The recommended analyses are conducted through Neurazon (Canada). These are optional recommendations, not obligatory, and are not performed directly at our center. They provide additional insights into the child's developmental profile and support the creation of a personalized intervention plan.

Therapy:

 Neuroplasticity rehabilitation therapy: Begin 2–3 sessions per week to support information processing, communication, and overall cognitive development.





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Conclusion:

Rashid-Ali demonstrates developmental and information processing delays with features of hyperlexia between types 2 and 3. He does not score as autistic but presents with acquired features requiring targeted intervention. With consistent therapy and supportive analyses, his developmental progress is expected to improve significantly.
