

## Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

**Date of Visit:** 22-07-2025

**Child's Name:** adham-belal, alkhoul

**Date of Birth:** 12.12.2012

### Overview:

Adham visited our center for a developmental assessment. During the evaluation, he presented with developmental delays and information processing delays. His profile shows traits consistent with hyperlexia, closer to Type 2 but not fully qualifying for it. Additionally, Adham exhibits **acquired features of high-functioning autism**, which are likely the result of these delays rather than a primary autistic condition. This is not a final diagnosis, and the child remains open for significant improvement with the right intervention.

### Recommended Plan:

#### 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Duration: 4 months
- Reassessment: In-person, after 4 months
- Purpose: Establish a new developmental baseline and refine the intervention strategy
- Continuation: The protocol should be followed consistently at home and in therapy sessions

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### Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada):

1. **Precision Health Analysis – Neurazon (Canada)**
  - A detailed investigation into the underlying causes
  - **Sample Type:** Saliva
  - **Result Timeframe:** 4 months (business days)
2. **Neuronal Growth Factors Absorption – Neurazon (Canada)**
  - A comprehensive screening for absorption capacity of key brain nutrients
  - **Sample Type:** Hair
  - **Result Timeframe:** 2 months (business days)
  - **Frequency:** Repeated every 6–12 months

### **Recommended Therapy:**

- **Speech Therapy (2 sessions/week)**
- **Occupational Therapy (2 sessions/week)**
- **Light Therapy / Mito-Therapy (2 sessions/week)**
- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:** To be introduced in later stages once readiness is confirmed


