Assessment Summary:

Mohamed was assessed on 03-July-2025 for ongoing concerns regarding his cognitive, behavioral, and developmental profile. Based on clinical observations and review of available history, Mohamed presents with:

- Information processing delays
- Intellectual developmental delay features
- Global developmental delays

These delays have contributed to **acquired features of autism**, which may include difficulties in communication, social interaction, and adaptive functioning. The presentation suggests that the autism features are not primary but rather acquired due to underlying neurological or metabolic disruptions. Further assessment is required to explore the underlying biomedical and neurodevelopmental contributors to these delays.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Implement an individualized intervention protocol focused on improving information processing capacity.
- Continue the program for **4 months**, followed by a **reevaluation**, preferably conducted in person.
- Establish a baseline of cognitive and processing abilities to track improvement.
- Based on progress, continue or adjust the intervention plan accordingly.

Therapy Recommendations (after identifying the causes):

- Neuroplasticity therapy:
 - To enhance brain adaptability and support regulation and cognitive integration. *Recommended after the 4-month initial protocol phase.*
- Speech and Occupational Therapy:
 To address expressive and receptive language delays, fine motor skills, and daily functioning.
