Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Date of Visit: 18-08-2025

Child's Name: Alyazia-Yousef Almogzwi

Date of Birth: 02-12-2020

Overview:

Alyazia was assessed at our center on the above date. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays and developmental delays**. The child has a **history of febrile seizures** associated with immune system responses, which may have contributed to her developmental challenges. Despite these factors, Alyazia has shown **notable improvement with detox protocols**, indicating readiness for further progress.

The current assessment shows that Alyazia does **not meet the criteria for autism**, but her developmental progress remains delayed compared to age expectations. Given that she is older and has not yet achieved adequate developmental milestones, **further analysis is necessary** to clarify the underlying biological contributors and to optimize her therapeutic plan.

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Recommended Plan:

1. **Development Protocol for Information Processing**
 - Implement a structured developmental protocol for **4 months**.
 - Reassess afterward, preferably **in person**, to establish a clearer baseline and adjust the plan.
 - Continue with the intervention, modifying strategies as necessary based on progress.
2. **Main Recommended Analyses (through Canada – Neurazon):**
 - **Please refer to their report and assessment. These analyses are not done at EICADD.**
3. **Therapy:**
 - **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:**
Begin intensive sessions **2–3 times per week** as soon as possible. Focus areas should include information processing, memory, and communication development.

Conclusion:

This assessment is **not a final diagnosis** but a developmental evaluation. Alyazia has demonstrated improvement with previous detox protocols, but continued delays indicate the need for deeper analysis and more intensive therapy. With targeted interventions and structured protocols, further developmental progress is expected.
